

Oceans support food and jobs for humans because of fishing for eating and selling.




Oceans and beaches are important for tourism. Tourists spend money which supports local communities.



Human geography – features of our world that have been made by humans e.g. landmarks

Physical geography – features of our world that are natural e.g. rivers, seas, weather





Key Vocabulary					
Ocean	An ocean is a very big area of salt water between the continents.				
Land	Land is any part of Earth's surface that is not covered by water				
Atmosphere	The atmosphere is the layer of gases that surrounds Earth. It includes the oxygen we need to breathe, so it is essential for life on Earth.				
Planet	A planet is a large round object that travels around a star in space.				
Satellite	A satellite is an object in space that orbits or circles around a bigger object in space. These can be natural like the moon or artificial ones like the International Space Station.				
2D	A two-dimensional (2D) object is flat - its dimensions are height (top to bottom) and width (side to side).				
3D	A three-dimensional (3D) object is solid - its dimensions are height (top to bottom), width (side to side) and depth (front to back).				
Continent	A continent is a large land mass on Earth and there are seven: Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Europe, North America, South America, Australasia				
Tourist	A tourist is someone who travels to a different place from where they live for a holiday				
Four compass points N, E, S, W	North, East, South, and West are directions at 90 degree intervals (rt angles) in a clockwise direction on a compass
