





Learning: To use maps and atlas to locate cities, country, neighbouring countries, continents, rivers and oceans.

source	where a river starts
tributaries	a stream or river that flows into or joins a main river
meander	a curve in a river
floodplain	a flat area surrounding a river or stream
delta	a wetland area near to the river mouth
mouth	where a river enters another river, sea, ocean or lake

Northern Hemisphere		Part of the planet north of the equator
Southern Hemisphere		South of the planet south of the equator
Equator		The imaginary circle around the centre of the earth
Tropics of Cancer and Capricorn		The most northerly (Cancer) or southernly (Capricorn) latitude
Latitude		The distance north or south of the equator measured in degrees
Tropical Climate		Places found on or close to the equator. The weather is wet and warm
Temperate Climate		Some hot and some cold weather
