# Trade and Ancient Greece

The children will find out about world trade, ancient Greece and the circulatory system

## Topic Overview

During Geography this term the children will learn about world trade. They will look at how countries import and export goods and the benefits of trade. The children will then look at how the UK trades with Greece. This will then lead into our next History topic after half term which is Ancient Greece. During this topic the children will learn what it was like to live in Greece during this period of time. In Science children will learn about the circulatory system. Children will have the opportunity to investigate how the amount of exercise affects our circulatory system. We will also study the heart, lungs and blood and look at the impact of diet and exercise on the body. After half term we will move on to the plant lifecycle, looking at the seven life processes.

## Topic Outcomes

By the end of the topic the children will have a good understanding of where our goods come from and what a supply chain looks like. They will be able to recognise how we import and export goods and why trade is important. In History, children will understand when and where the Ancient Greeks lived, who the Greek Gods and Goddesses were and gain an insight into the architecture. In Science they will be able to label the circulatory system, including the heart and understand how it works. They will also be able to understand the benefits of a healthy lifestyle.
