

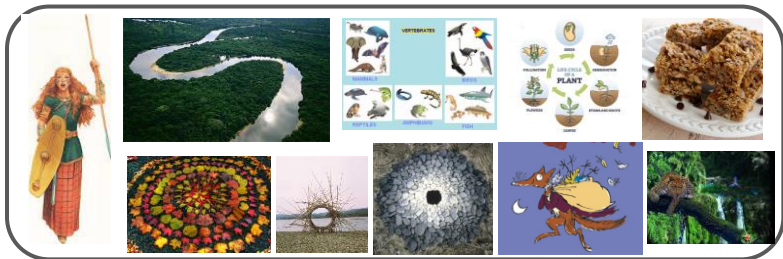


Water Class

Living Things and their Habitats & From London to Rio

Topic Overview

In the first part of the Summer Term, the class will complete their Roman topic by learning about the invasion of Britain and the role of Boudicca and the Celts [this is continuation from last term due to its short length]. They will then move on to geography where they will be comparing London to Rio and considering where they would rather live. The class will explore how the natural world inspires art through sculptures and observational drawing. They will also become coding and animation experts in Computing. In Science, they will learn about the plant cycle and how to classify living things. At the end of the term, we'll design, make and evaluate our own healthy snacks!

To compare the differences and similarities between a region of the UK and a region of South America.
